



# CODE: Community Outreach & Dermatology Education




#### **PROJECT GOALS**




# CODE seeks to correct under-representation of dermatologists in Oregon's rural communities





#### OR Locations for CODE Users (all)

### CODE research study

- Patients, presenters, and participants of the conference were asked to participate in a survey study to track conference participation and case characteristics over time.
- Data from these surveys was collected in a secure research repository for future study.
- We used survey data to improve the conference format and identify skin conditions that need further research and study.

### Presenter Objectives

- 21% of participants felt that presenting a patient's case through CODE prevented the need for an additional referral/consultation.
- On average, presenting a case through CODE saved patients
   55 miles of travel one-way.
- CODE participants felt more confident managing their patient's skin condition.
