CALL FOR MENTORS

The Amyloidosis Foundation and Pfizer Global Medical Grants are excited to announce a new mentorship program. Our aim is to create formal, short-term (9 month) Mentor/Mentee partnerships between Mentors and Healthcare Institutions which encourage the transfer of expertise and knowledge between established and emerging Cardiac Amyloidosis centers. Through this independent effort, our goals are to:

- Support the development of emerging Cardiac Amyloid Centers to ensure health equity and address health care disparities across the United States for patients with ATTR-CM
- Enable Mentor to guide Mentee towards achieving his/her developmental objectives ultimately ensuring appropriate diagnosis, treatment, management, and comprehensive care of patients with ATTR-CM
- Provide emerging centers a Community of Practice to share ideas, best practices and ask for feedback

The Cardiac Amyloidosis mentor mATTch pRogram aims to support career development for less experienced healthcare professionals from all backgrounds and disciplines in the field of cardiac amyloidosis. It aims to create a valuable network, increase knowledge sharing and improve interpersonal and communication skills

Mentor Eligibility Criteria and Responsibilities

A mentor is an experienced and trusted advisor who has a special interest in supporting another individual to develop into a successful professional and who has experience in the field of Cardiac Amyloidosis (clinical, leadership, research and/or education). A mentor acts as a guide for a healthcare professional (HCP) who wants to further develop their career and advance their center’s care of patients with amyloidosis, including cardiac amyloidosis.

Mentor Eligibility Criteria:

- Actively caring for patients with amyloidosis, including cardiac amyloidosis, located within an Institution which is capable of providing multidisciplinary care
- Research experience
- Possess excellent communication skills
- Demonstrate a strong interest in helping a motivated mentee achieve developmental objectives

Responsibilities of Mentor:

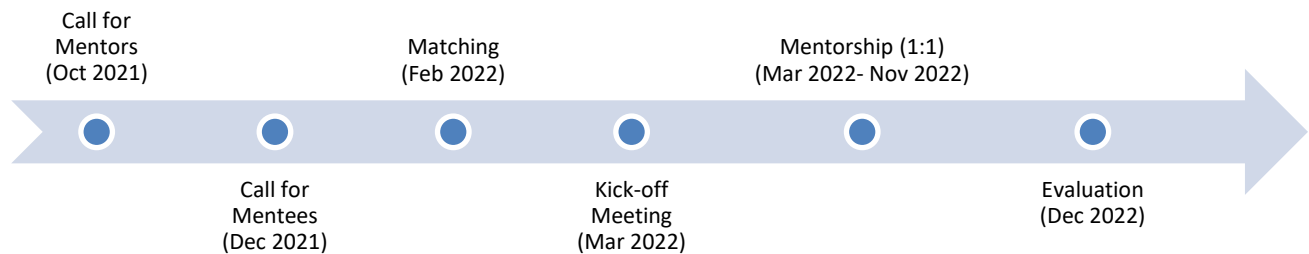
- Work with the mentee to help them achieve their developmental objectives
- Work with the mentee to determine how the relationship evolves
- Address healthcare disparities with mentee
- Be available and accessible for online meetings or phone discussions (minimum of 1 hour per month for duration of 9 months) with their mentee

What is expected of the Mentor and Mentee?

- Commitment to meet at least once a month for 9 months
- Commitment to form a mentoring relationship around the mentee's developmental objectives and goals in the field of cardiac amyloidosis
- Evaluation of the mentorship program by both mentors and mentees at the end of the mentorship program

Mentorship Timeline

The program will run for a minimum period of 9 months. Mentors will be compensated for their time.
