

Pfizer Fellowship Grant RFP 2023 Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD) Fellowship – India

It is our intent to support institutions with fellowship programs for gastroenterologists/ physicians working in the field of gastroenterology, that have a strong focus on clinical practice, research, and education.

Project Types and Area of Interest

IBD Fellowship

The goal of this RFP is to offer remuneration for the fellow enrolled as part of the IBD fellowship program Grants will be awarded based on the strength of the requesting organization's ability to provide expert mentorship, training, and guidance to the fellow.

Key Milestones

- Application submission deadline: September 22, 2023
- Anticipated decision notification date: November 20, 2023
- Anticipated project start date: January 2024

Funding Range and Project Length

Funding will be for 10 institutes for hosting 1 year fellowships.



I. Eligibility

Geographic Scope:

India

Applicant Eligibility Criteria

- Accredited Academic institution/ tertiary care hospitals with interest in supporting both established and emerging programs in IBD gastroenterology.
- Do not include the name of the potential fellow(s) in application materials. This grant will be awarded to an institution, not an individual.
- Institutions with fellowship programs that include independent research and a strong mentoring program.
- Clinical training may be included in the program but is not required.
- No aspect of the fellowship program can benefit Pfizer's business or a Pfizer asset.
- Examples of independent research include: observational studies and outcomes research studies where the primary focus is the scientific understanding of disease; use of screening tools and their impact on improvement of patient health.
 - Examples of research that would **not** be eligible include research involving the study and/or
 evaluation of any pharmaceutical product and basic science and/or fundamental research (in
 animal model, in-vitro, etc.).
- Examples of clinical training include: educational time with an interdisciplinary team in review of case examples and relevant didactic training as well as use of tools for improvement in patient health for specific therapeutic areas or conditions.
- Fellow time spent in the clinical setting that is supported through grant funds must not be billed as patient care.
- Should possess valid FCRA certificate or exemption.

II. Requirements

Specific Area of Interest for this RFP:

- It is our intent to support institutions with fellowship programs for gastroenterologists/ physicians working in the field of gastroenterology, that have a strong focus on clinical practice, research, and education to further the understanding/strengthening for proper diagnosis and management of chronic immunegastroenterological diseases like UC and CD.
- Programs that prioritize diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) principles, address health care disparities, social determinants of health are always encouraged. Grants will be awarded based on the strength of the requesting organization's ability to provide expert mentorship, training, and guidance to the fellow.
- Projects evaluating the efficacy of therapeutic or diagnostic agents will not be considered.

Requirements for Prospective Fellows:

• Institution must ensure that any fellow that will receive grant funds should be an Indian citizen, resident in India during the time of application and pursuit of the fellowship.

Budget



- Grant funding is available to support one fellow for up to a year up to \$25,000USD. The budget can only
 include salary and support of the fellow benefits. Approximately 10 Fellowships will be supported. Total
 potential funding available is \$250,000USD.
- Grant funds cannot be used for overhead or indirect costs.
- Funding will be awarded to the institution, not an individual.
- Fellow time spent in the clinical setting that is supported through grant funds must not be billed as patient care.
- No aspect of the fellowship program budget can reflect a benefit to Pfizer's business or a Pfizer asset.

Appendix

Proposal Requirements

Applications will be accepted via the online portal listed in the How to Submit section. The proposal should be submitted in Word or a PDF. This document should be formatted with single-spaced using 12-point font and 1-inch margins and should not exceed 10-15 pages. When uploading your proposal please ensure it addresses the following sections:

Cover Page (not to exceed 1 page)

- Title: Please include the fellowship title, and main institutions
- Abstract: Please include an abstract summary of your proposal including the goal of the fellowship, methods the institution uses to support the fellow's training and research, and assessment.

Overall Goals and Objectives of the Fellowship

- Describe the overall goal of the fellowship.
- Describe the focus of research and/or clinical training as applicable that is being supported in general terms based on the categorizations listed in this application.

Methods

- Please describe the mentoring process.
- Include a description of the methods used to support the fellow and their research and/or clinical training.

Resources

- Please describe the institution's academic, clinical training, and research capacity.
- Describe the facilities/resources that are made available to the fellow.
- Provide a summary of relevant past work that is applicable.

Challenges

Please provide a summary of potential challenges and of plans for addressing those challenges.

Institutional Support

- Division Head/ Department Chair Letter of Support.
- Primary mentor; Secondary mentor (if applicable) Letter of Support.

Budget

- Budget: Address any additional sources of financial support for this proposal, including current and pending sources of funding.
- Any request for funds beyond salary support will not be provided as part of the award.

Anticipated Project Timeline

Provide an anticipated timeline for your project including project start/end dates.

Additional Information

• If there is any additional information you feel Pfizer should be aware of concerning the importance of this project, please summarize here.
