

Pfizer Fellowship Grant Request for Proposals

Competitive Grant Program – using Expert Review Panel

2026 Hemophilia Fellowship – United States



Overview

This competitive grant program seeks to support an institution-based fellowship that emphasizes shared decision making (SDM), patient education, and multidisciplinary team-based care. The intent is to strengthen the hemophilia care through equitable education, and patient-centered shared decision making in a rapidly evolving treatment landscape.



Geographic Scope

United States



Project Types and Area of Interest

It is our intent to support a fellowship program at an institution with established clinical training programs. Institutions are encouraged to identify and address the educational needs, barriers and gaps for People Living with Hemophilia (PLWH) relating to the new treatment landscape.

A structured education program including care for underserved populations and SDM training curriculum, mentorship, and a practical capstone project are strongly encouraged.

Funding Range and Project Length

Grant funding is available to support a one year fellowship up to \$100,000 USD.

I. Eligibility

Geographic Scope:

- United States

Applicant Eligibility Criteria:

- Accredited, US-based academic institution.
- Do not include the name of the potential fellow(s) in application materials. This grant will be awarded to an institution, not an individual.
- Institutions with fellowship programs that include independent research and a strong mentoring program. Clinical training may be included in the program but is not required.
- No aspect of the fellowship program can benefit Pfizer's business or a Pfizer asset.
- Examples of independent research include: observational studies and outcomes research studies where the primary focus is the scientific understanding of disease; use of screening tools and their impact on improvement of patient health.
- Examples of research that would **not** be eligible include research involving the study and/or evaluation of any pharmaceutical product and basic science and/or fundamental research (in animal model, in-vitro, etc.).
- Examples of clinical training include: educational time with an interdisciplinary team in review of case examples and relevant didactic training as well as use of tools for improvement in patient health for specific therapeutic areas or conditions.
- Fellow time spent in the clinical setting that is supported through grant funds must not be billed as patient care.

II. Requirements

Specific Area of Interest for this RFP:

- It is our intent to support strengthening of hemophilia care through equitable education, and patient-centered shared decision making in a rapidly evolving treatment landscape.
- Our aim is to support a fellowship program at a U.S. institution offering clinical training, particularly in regions facing ongoing workforce challenges. The selected institution should demonstrate a robust commitment to clinical practice, research, and education, advancing knowledge in the field of hemophilia.
- Grants will be awarded based on the strength of the requesting organization's ability to provide expert mentorship, training, and guidance to the fellow.

Requirements for Prospective Fellows:

- Institution must ensure that any fellow that will receive grant funds must be a U.S. Worker (U.S. citizen, permanent resident, refugee, or asylee), or hold an appropriate non-immigrant visa status authorizing employment in the U.S.
- U.S. Physician Payments Sunshine Act ("Sunshine Act") and other transparency law requirements must be satisfied with respect to meals, payments and other transfers of value. As a condition of the grant, the selected fellow will be named in transparency reporting as a recipient of grant funding.

Budget:

- Grant funding is available to support one fellow for up to a year at \$100,000 USD. The budget can only include salary and support of the fellow benefits.
- Grant funds cannot be used for overhead or indirect costs.
- Funding will be awarded to the institution, not an individual.

- Fellow time spent in the clinical setting that is supported through grant funds must not be billed as patient care.
- No aspect of the fellowship program budget can reflect a benefit to Pfizer's business or a Pfizer asset.

Review and Approval Process:

- A specific grant program RFP uses an expert review panel (ERP) to make final grant decisions.
- The panels are comprised of professionals from the medical community with advanced degrees and expertise in particular clinical areas, or specific needs of a geographic region/learner group, or expertise in research, continuing professional development or quality improvement.
- Proposals will be evaluated based on the following evaluation criteria: fellowship goals, objectives, medical needs and population health, patient care experience, program criteria, mentoring, training opportunities, and resources.

Mechanism by which Applicants will be Notified:

- All applicants will be notified via email by the dates noted above.
- Applicants may be asked for additional clarification during the review period.

Cover Page (not to exceed 1 page)

- Title: Please include the fellowship title, and main institutions
- Abstract: Please include an abstract summary of your proposal including the goal of the fellowship, methods the institution uses to support the fellow's training and research, and assessment.

Overall Goals and Objectives of the Fellowship

- Describe the overall goal of the fellowship.
- Describe the focus of research and/or clinical training as applicable that is being supported in general terms based on the categorizations listed in this application.

Methods

- Please describe the mentoring process.
- Include a description of the methods used to support the fellow and their research and/or clinical training. (e.g. details on research training opportunities, how will they develop their skills?)
- Please describe how the Fellowship supports diversity, equity, and inclusion either through the Fellow being selected or through the mentoring team that is directly involved

Resources

- Please describe the institution's academic, clinical training, and research capacity.
- Describe the facilities/resources that are made available to the fellow.
- Provide a summary of relevant past work that is applicable.

Challenges

- Please provide a summary of potential challenges and of plans for addressing those challenges.

Institutional Support

- Division Head/ Department Chair Letter of Support.
- Primary mentor; Secondary mentor (if applicable) Letter of Support

Budget

- Budget: Address any additional sources of financial support for this proposal, including current and pending sources of funding
- Any request for funds beyond salary support will not be provided as part of the award
