# **Independent Grants for Learning & Change (IGLC)**

**Call for Grant Applications (CGA)** 

Asia Pacific (APAC) Local Community Grants

## I. Background

The mission of Pfizer Independent Grants for Learning & Change (IGL&C) is to partner with the global healthcare community to improve patient outcomes in areas of mutual interest through support of measurable learning and change strategies. "Independent" means that the projects funded by Pfizer are the full responsibility of the recipient organization. Pfizer has no influence over any aspect of the projects and only asks for reports about the results and the impact of the projects in order to share them publicly.

Through this CGA we encourage organizations to submit grant requests that, if funded, will support education in a specific disease state, therapeutic area, or broader area of educational need. Educational activities should not be focused on products specific to Pfizer.

When a CGA is issued, it is posted on the IGL&C website in the <u>Grants Process section</u> and is sent via e-mail to registered users in our grants system. Some CGAs may also be posted on the websites of other relevant organizations.

#### **IV. Terms and Conditions**

Please note the following two prohibitions:

- 1. No portion of a Pfizer independent grant may be used to support food or beverages associated with an activity or initiative. All grant recipient organizations will be required to certify during reconciliation that funds were not used for food and/or beverages for learners/participants in any capacity.
- 2. No portion of a Pfizer independent grant may be used to purchase/distribute "items of value" (items that possess a discernible value on the open market, such as textbooks) for faculty, learners or participants. All grant recipient organizations will be required to certify during the reconciliation that funds were not used for items of value for faculty, learners or participants. This prohibition does NOT apply for compensating physicians to take anonymous surveys (e.g., providing gift cards to physicians to take a survey anonymously in order to identify needs assessment).

## Appendix: APAC Local Community Grants Submission Template

Grant Applications should be single-spaced using <u>Calibri 12-point font</u> and <u>1-inch margins</u>. Note there is a <u>15-page limit</u> exclusive of references. Please submit all materials in <u>English</u> using <u>US dollars</u>. Please include the following:

## Required:

- A. Title
- B. Organizational Description: Describe the attributes of the institutions/organizations that will support and facilitate the execution of the project, the leadership of the proposed project, and the specific role of each partner in the proposed project.
- C. Goal: Briefly state the overall goal of the project.
- D. Objectives: List the objectives you plan to meet with your project, in terms of learning and expected outcomes.
- E. Background: Include a summary that outlines the background and need for the project.
- F. Target Audience: Describe the primary audience(s) targeted for this project. Indicate whom you believe will directly benefit from the project outcomes. Describe the overall population size as well as the size of your sample population.
- G. Project Design and Methods: Describe the planned project, the educational approach, and the way the planned methods address the established need.
- H. Timeline
- I. Outcomes Evaluation: In terms of the metrics used for the needs assessment, describe how you will determine if the gap was addressed for the target group. Identify the sources of data you anticipate using to make the determination. Describe how you expect to collect and analyze the data. Explain the method used to control for other factors outside this project (e.g., use of a control group or comparison with baseline data). Quantify the amount of change expected from this project in terms of your target audience. Describe how you will determine if the target audience was fully engaged in the project.
- J. Budget (See template available in application)
  - While estimating your budget please keep the following items in mind:
    - Budgets should be submitted in US dollars; organizations are responsible for calculating exchange rates.
    - Grants awarded by IGLC cannot be used to purchase therapeutic agents (prescription or nonprescription).

- Pfizer maintains a company-wide, maximum allowed overhead rate of 28% for projects.
- A separate Excel file should be uploaded. This does not count toward the page limit.

  - At the conclusion of your program, a reconciliation of expenses is required using the original budget file submitted.

#### Optional materials:

- K. Innovation: Explain what measures you have taken to assure that this project idea is original and does not duplicate other projects or materials already developed. Describe how this project builds upon existing work, pilot projects, or ongoing projects developed either by your institution or other institutions related to this project.
- L. Dissemination Plan: Describe how the project may have extended benefit beyond the grant. Will the teaching materials be made available to others to use? Will there be tools or resources that are made publicly available beyond the initial project. Describe how the project outcomes might be broadly disseminated.
- M. Additional Information: If there is any additional information you feel Pfizer should be aware of concerning the importance of this project, please summarize it in within the page limitations.
