Purpose

- Define a universal, inter-professional profile of the knowledge and skills required for effective antimicrobial stewardship (AS).
- Work with partner organizations to form a baseline: American Society of Health System Pharmacists (ASHP), Infectious Diseases Society of America (IDSA), MAD-ID, National Foundation of Infectious Diseases (NFID), Pediatric Infectious Diseases Society (PIDS) and Society for Infectious Disease Pharmacists (SIDP)



Scope

- Create a distilled a list of learning needs and priorities to guide initiatives to advance the practice and impact of antimicrobial stewardship in a needs document
- Create a Web resource: <u>www.stewardship-education.org</u>
- Reach pharmacists and physicians who prescribe & fill antibiotics
