What is the Multicultural Health Equity Collective?

The Pfizer Multicultural Health Equity Collective (MHEC) focuses on **helping to improve health equity across ethnic groups and other underrepresented communities** facing significant health disparities.

The MHEC team works in partnership with key groups across the US – including patient advocacy organizations, healthcare provider associations, community groups, and legislative caucuses – to address health disparities among the most vulnerable populations through unique community programming and outreach. In 2019 alone, the MHEC engaged with more than 40 organizations and supported nearly 70 individual events or activities across the country.

Our work is guided by the Pfizer Multicultural Advisory Council (PMAC). The PMAC is a dynamic group of leaders from organizations that help inform the work of the MHEC and has enhanced Pfizer's level of cultural competency in reaching underrepresented communities. The PMAC engages with Pfizer on important health and policy issues and provides counsel on specific Pfizer initiatives.

- Pfizer collaborated with Anthem, National Urban League, and City
 of Hope to create the Take Action for Health e-toolkit to address
 healthcare disparities.
- Take Action for Health focuses on encouraging the African American community to get screened for specific health conditions.

National Medical Association (NMA) and National Black Nurses Association (NBNA)

• In partnership with Pfizer, NMA and NBNA conducted a study to examine awareness and attitudes of multi-dimensional health; clinical trial participation; perception of one's own state of health; and levels of motivation to take action on health among the African American community. The results informed new approaches to creating greater health equity for African Americans.

Social Determinants of Health Grants

Launched new program in 2020 to advance health equity and improve health outcomes in African American communities in the US. These grants support 10 organizations working to address social determinants of health and strengthen health systems in the US.

COVID-19 Relief Grants

 charitable grants to help partners combat the health effects of the
 COVID-19 pandemic in the US and address the significant burden and
 unique needs seen in multi-cultural communities, building on Pfizer's
