Contributions to the Pfizer PAC are completely voluntary. Your decision whether to participate will not affect your employment status. Contributions to the PAC are for political purposes and are not deductible as charitable contributions for Federal income tax purposes. The Pfizer PAC is required by law to report to the Federal Election Commission the name, address, occupation and employer of any individual who makes a PAC contribution of more than \$200 in a calendar year.



Pfizer PAC is a nonpartisan organization providing opportunities for our employees to participate in the political process. Participation in the Political Action Committee (PAC) ensures support for local, state and federal officials who share Pfizer's vision and values for healthcare.

A seven member PAC Steering Committee, made up of Pfizer employees, reviews and approves all recommendations for PAC and state corporate contributions. Candidates' views on issues that impact Pfizer and our employees, as well as the presence of Pfizer facilities or employees in a candidate's district or state factor into Pfizer's choice of whether or not to make a contribution to a candidate.

Through increased awareness of Pfizer PAC activities, our hope is for more of our employees to become interested in the political process and to ensure their voices are heard.

Why Should I Join Pfizer PAC?

Every day, elected officials at the local, state and federal levels make decisions that impact Pfizer and the operation of our business. To affect these decisions, it is vital for Pfizer employees to become involved in the political process. Through Pfizer PAC, employees have an opportunity to make their voices heard concerning issues vitally important to Pfizer and the pharmaceutical industry.

Pfizer PAC allows our company to fully participate in the American democratic process, and your voluntary contribution will help strengthen our collective voice. Contributions to Pfizer PAC are completely voluntary.

Regardless of your decision to join Pfizer PAC or the amount you contribute, your employment status will not be affected.

Contributions to the Pfizer PAC are used for political purposes and are not tax deductible as charitable contributions for Federal income tax purposes. Also, by law, the Pfizer PAC is required to report to the Federal Election Commission the name, address, occupation and employer of any individual who makes a PAC contribution of more than \$200 in a calendar year.

Who Did the PAC Support?

During the 2004 election cycle, 1,846 candidates were supported by the Pfizer PAC. True to its nonpartisan commitment to support any candidate sharing Pfizer's vision and values for health care, the Pfizer PAC supported 1,126 Republicans and 720 Democratic candidates. A complete list of Pfizer PAC and state corporate contributions for the 2004 election cycle is included in this report.

Notes to Combined Financial Statements

1. Fund Description

The Pfizer Inc. PAC (the Fund) was formed by Pfizer Inc. (the Company) to solicit and receive voluntary political contributions from employees and stockholders of the Company and certain subsidiaries to assist candidates for elective office. The Fund was registered with the Federal Election Commission in April 1976. Contributions may be designated by the contributor for a specific candidate for political office of a political party. Contributions which are undesignated are subsequently designated by the Fund's Steering Committee. Contributions designated by contributors were not material in 2004 and 2003.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

BASIS OF PRESENTATION

The combined financial statement activities of the Fund include several political action committees which were formed to comply with certain state laws. The accounts of the Fund are maintained on a cash basis. All administrative costs of the Fund are borne by the Company.

TAX STATUS

The Fund is registered as a political organization and, as such, is subject to tax on non-exempt function income, which includes interest income, if any.

3. External Financing

The Fund borrows cash to contribute to candidates in anticipation of employee contributions. The fund did not have any borrowings during 2004 and 2003. During 2003 the Fund repaid \$30,000 in borrowings outstanding as of December 31, 2002.



Independent Auditors' Report

The Policy Committee Pfizer Inc. PAC:

We have audited the accompanying combined statements of assets and liabilities arising from cash transactions of the Pfizer Inc. PAC (the Fund) as of December 31, 2004 and 2003, and the related combined statements of revenues and expenditures arising from cash transactions for the years then ended. These combined financial statements are the responsibility of the Fund's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these combined financial statements based on our audits.

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the combined financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the combined financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall combined financial statement presentation. We believe that our audits provide a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As described in Note 2, these combined financial statements were prepared on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

In our opinion, the combined financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the assets and liabilities arising from cash transactions of the Pfizer Inc. PAC as of December 31, 2004 and 2003, and its revenues and expenditures arising from cash transactions during the years then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 2.
