Geographic Scope	African nations
Background	RCNi is a subsidiary of the Royal College of Nursing, delivering high-quality educational products and services for nursing teams globally. RCNi's vision is to inspire the nursing community by connecting, championing and developing the whole nursing team, enabling them to focus on the delivery of excellent patient care. RCNi has developed RCNi Learning (rcnilearning.com), an interactive learning resource designed to help nurses enhance their clinical and soft skills.
	The mission of Pfizer Independent Grants for Learning & Change (IGLC) is to partner with the global healthcare community to improve patient outcomes in areas of mutual interest through support of measurable learning and change strategies. "Independent" means that the projects funded by Pfizer are the full responsibility of the recipient organisation. Pfizer has no influence over any aspect of the projects and only asks for reports about the results and the impact of the projects in order to share them publicly.
	The intent of this document is to encourage organisations with a focus in nurse education, continuing professional development and/or quality improvement to submit an application for access to RCNi Learning for the nursing team within their organisation.
Funding and Administration of Projects	Selected applications will have access to RCNi Learning funded by Pfizer Independent Grants for Learning and Change. Provision of the access as well as operational and technical support will be provided by RCNi.
Applicant Eligibility	Nursing, allied health and medical schools, healthcare institutions (both large and small), academic institutions and other organisations with a mission related to healthcare involving the nursing team. Access to RCNi Learning can only be awarded to organisations under this RFP, not individuals.

Specific Areas of	To improve access to learning resources for nurses in Africa across a variety of clinical

RCNi Learning is a gold standard interactive programme of self-study modules to help enable both student and qualified nurses to develop important nursing skills and deliver the best possible patient care. For more information on what the resource includes and how your institution may benefit from access, visit rcnilearning.com . Pfizer and RCNi invite academic and healthcare organisations with an interest in improving nurse education, continuing professional development and thus outcomes for patients to apply for provision of access to RCNi Learning. It is expected that all applications will include a needs assessment detailing why access to the programme would benefit the applying organisation, and also an implementation plan detailing how the training will be utilised and disseminated. Furthermore, it is expected
	that successful organisations will commit to evaluating the learning outcomes from the programme. Whilst applications will be accepted from all countries listed in the Geographic Scope section of this document, priority will be given to applications from organisations based in lower income countries (according to the World Bank Classifications). Priority will also be given to applications from organisations higher income countries where it can be demonstrated that there is local need for support that might not be reflected by the country's income status. Priority will further be given to applications from organisations with the most robust implementation plans.
Rationale for the Programme	Nursing is a critical factor in determining the quality of care in hospitals, in the community and the nature of patient outcomes ¹ . Because it is well-recognised that there are nurse shortages in African nations ² , it is of fundamental importance to ensure that the existing nursing team and those planning to become nurses have adequate opportunity for education and Continuing Professional Development (CPD). CPD is important for nurses globally, but in developing nations with evolving health challenges, CPD becomes of paramount importance. Resources to provide CPD opportunities for nurses in African nations are often scarce ³ . RCNi Learning offers the opportunity for nurses at any stage in their career to engage in self-directed learning to help develop their clinical and professional skills across a broad range of clinical areas. This programme provides the opportunity for institutional access to RCNi to help to contribute to educational and CPD activities for nurses without the need for financial investment.
Out of Scope of this RFP	Applications requesting monetary grants of any kind (this RFP aims only to provide access to RCNi Learning to successful institutions)

Expected Scope of Applications

Individual applications requesting institution access for up to: 10, 50, 100, 150, 200, 250 and 500 RCNi Learning programme users will be considered.

The funding required for provision of access for users increases with the number of users included within the application, and as such, it is important that the projected outcomes of the application are appropriately associated with the application number of programme users requested.

Please note that no funds will be transferred to the organisations to whom access to RCNi Learning is awarded. Access will be purchased on behalf of the successful organisations by Pfizer, and access granted by RCNi.

Pfizer will clearly state in any approval notification, the review panel's rationale for supporting a given institution's application and the number of users that shall be granted access at that institution.

Access to RCNi Learning that is granted to successful applicants will be available for 12 months. Following access, successful organisations will have a further 6 months to evaluate the utility of the programme and assess any changes that they have made to practice as a result.

Characteristics of a successful project

In order to increase the capacity of the health care system to provide improvement in the care of patients, we are interested in receiving proposals that:

- Demonstrate that a needs assessment has been conducted
- Include a robust and well-defined plan for evaluation and dissemination of learning
- Build the network of nurse education champions in Africa
- Include a plan to sustain the project beyond the period of access to RCNi Learning.
